- *The Glory hymns at the end of Matins:*

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit.

As ye passed throughout creation filling it with light, O disciples of the Savior, with your teachings ye burnt up the error of the idols like wood, and ye saved the nations, catching them in your nets and drawing them up from the deep of ignorance unto divine knowledge. And now intercede with Christ, that He be gracious unto us in the Day of Judgment.

Both Now and ever and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Thou hast transcended all blessings, O Virgin Theotokos! For Hades hath been spoiled by Him who was incarnate of thee. Yea, Adam was recalled, the curse was abolished. Eve was delivered, death was caused to die, and we were made to live again. Wherefore, with praise we cry: Blessed art Thou, O Christ our God, who hast thus shown Thy pleasure. Glory to Thee!

- *The Resurrectional Troparion, following the Great Doxology:*

Having risen again from the tomb, and having burst asunder the bonds of Hades, Thou didst unbind the condemnation of death, O Lord, redeeming all men from the snares of the enemy. And having revealed Thyself to Thine Apostles, Thou didst send them forth to proclaim Thee. And through them Thou hast granted Thy peace unto the universe, O Thou who alone art merciful!

- *The Third Antiphon and the Little Entrance:*

Troparion for the Resurrection (Tone 8): O Compassionate One, thou didst descend from the heights; thou didst submit to the three day burial, that thou mightest deliver us from passion. Thou art our Life and our Resurrection, O Lord, glory to Thee.

- *Hymns of the day, following the Little Entrance:*

Repeat the Troparion for the Resurrection (from above)

Apolytikion of All Saints (Tone 4): Thy Church, O Christ God, hath regaled herself in the blood of Thy Martyrs throughout the entire world, as in porphyry and purple. Through them she lifteth her voice crying: Turn with Thy compassion toward Thy people, and grant peace to Thy city, and to our souls the Great Mercy.

Apolytikion for the Synaxis of the Apostles (Tone 3): O Holy Apostles, intercede with our merciful God, to grant our souls forgiveness of sins.

Troparion for St. George the Great-Martyr (Tone 4): Since thou art a liberator and deliverer of captives, a help and succour of the poor and needy, a healing physician of the sick, a contender and fighter for kings, O great among martyrs, the victory-clad George: Intercede with Christ God for the salvation of our souls.

Kontakion for All Saints (Tone 8): As first-fruits of our nature to the Planter of created things,

the world presenteth the God-bearing martyred Saints in offering unto Thee, O Lord. Through their earnest entreaties, keep Thy Church in deep peace and divine tranquility, through the pure Theotokos, O Thou Who art greatly merciful.

- *The Trisagion Hymn:*

Holy God, Holy Mighty, Holy Immortal One: Have mercy on us! (Three times)

Glory to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, both now and ever and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Holy Immortal One: Have mercy upon us!

Louder! Holy God, Holy Mighty, Holy Immortal One: Have mercy upon us!

The Epistle for All Saints

Clergy: Let us attend!

Reader: God is wonderful among His saints. Bless God in the congregations.

Clergy: Wisdom!

Reader: The Reading from the Epistle of St. Paul to the Hebrews (11:33-12:2).

Clergy: Let us attend!

Reader: Brethren, all the saints through faith conquered kingdoms, enforced justice, received promises, stopped the mouths of lions, quenched raging fire, escaped the edge of the sword, won strength out of weakness, became mighty in war, put foreign armies to flight. Women received their dead by resurrection. Some were tortured, refusing to accept release, so that they might rise again to a better life. Others suffered mocking and scourging, and even chains and imprisonment. They were stoned, they were sawn in two, they were tempted, they were killed with the sword; they went about in skins of sheep and goats, destitute, afflicted, ill-treated—of whom the world was not worthy—wandering over deserts and mountains, and in dens and caves of the earth. And all these, though well attested by their faith, did not receive what was promised, since God had foreseen something better for us, that apart from us they should not be made perfect. Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfection of our faith.

Clergy: Peace be to thee who readest.

Reader: And to thy spirit.

Chanter: The righteous cried, and the Lord heard them, and He delivered them out of all their tribulations. Many are the tribulations of the righteous, and the Lord shall deliver them out of them all.

All: Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia!

The Gospel for the Twelve Apostles

The Reading from the Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew (9:36-10:8).

At that time, when Jesus saw the crowds, He had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. Then He said to His Disciples, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; pray therefore the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest." And He called to Him His twelve Disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits, to cast them out, and to heal every disease and every infirmity. The names of the twelve Apostles are these: first, Simon, who is called Peter, and Andrew his brother; James the son of Zebedee, and John his brother; Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas and Matthew the tax collector; James the son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus; Simon the Cananaean, and Judas Iscariot, who betrayed Him. These twelve Jesus sent out, charging them, "Go nowhere among the Gentiles, and enter no town of the Samaritans, but go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. And preach as you go, saying, 'The kingdom of heaven is at hand.' Heal the sick, raise the dead, cleanse lepers, cast out demons. You received without paying, give without pay."

Communion Hymn of All Saints (Tone 8): Praise ye the Lord from the heavens. Rejoice in the Lord, O ye just: Praise becometh the upright. Alleluia.
